

GROUND RULES ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- It's a prerequisite for this course that you currently operate a motorcycle with good CLUTCH/THROTTLE CONTROL and with minimum-to-moderate amount of riding experience, and a motorcycle learner's permit, or higher. You must provide your own street legal, registered, insured, and safe motorcycle. If your name is not on the registration, you must have written permission to operate from the owner. This form is available at www.scridered.org.
- The class will start on time and will stay on schedule. If you miss a classroom session or range exercise, you will be dropped from the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- You are required to wear the following protective clothing during EVERY range session:
 - ❑ A DOT approved helmet (some are available for your use). **Half coverage helmets are prohibited!**
 - ❑ Eye protection, i.e., face-shield, sunglasses, goggles, glasses
 - ❑ Long sleeve shirt or jacket
 - ❑ Long pants, preferably jeans or leather
 - ❑ Over the ankle boots or shoes with low heels (heels over one inch are not suitable.)
 - ❑ Full finger gloves

You will not be permitted to participate in any range session without proper protective gear.
- Instructors will strive to provide a safe and orderly environment. Students behaving in a reckless, disrespectful, or unruly manner will be dropped from the class at the Instructor's discretion. Impairment is strictly prohibited. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- You will be learning to ride in a group environment. Instructors will do their best to provide individual coaching and instruction to each student. However, time is limited and the Instructors must keep the class on schedule.
- South Carolina's Technical College Intermediate Motorcycling Class takes a building block approach to improving your skills of riding a motorcycle. Each exercise builds on the skills, knowledge, and confidence acquired in the previous exercises. If you are unable to consistently achieve exercise objectives, the Instructor will counsel you out of the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- It's natural to be nervous about learning new skills on your motorcycle. While some fear is to be expected, excessive fear can lead to tenseness and ultimately to mistakes on the riding range. If the Instructor perceives that you have an excessive amount of fear and are a danger to yourself or other students, the Instructor will counsel you out of the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- You are expected to follow directions provided by the Instructors. Failing to following instructions repeatedly may be grounds for dismissal by the Instructor. A tuition refund will not be issued.

You will be required to pass both a written and riding assessment. The Instructor's decision is final with respect to whether you have passed or failed an assessment. **Retests are not authorized.** *Those who are successful in completing this class will be afforded an opportunity to take the SCDMV Motorcycle Driver's License Road Test. DMV is authorized to use this test in lieu of retesting you at the department. However, we make no guarantees.* A tuition refund will not be issued.
